Goa's taxi disputes indicate a broader economic challenge

Goa has one of the highest unemployment rates in the country. Across the state, workers and business owners are filled with anxiety about their livelihoods.

Lately, taxi unions in Goa protested against app-based services like Ola and Uber because they offer cheaper fares than traditional taxis. When Ola arrived in 2014, strikes occurred, and the government had to close it. The problem is that tourists complain about high prices, but the unions say they follow government-set rates. Even the government's own app, GoaMiles, faced opposition from taxi unions.

Taxi unions claim that the app-based service conflict is about providing jobs for locals. They believe that letting big corporations enter the state will lead to outsiders taking away jobs from the locals. Goa's economy depends primarily on three sectors – tourism, mining, and agriculture. Around 40% of the population is directly or indirectly dependent on tourism, around 15% is dependent on mining, and around 10% is dependent on agriculture.

The Centre for Monitoring Indian Economy, or CMIE, a private company, analyses unemployment rates in the country each month. Its March 2023 analysis showed that Goa's unemployment rate stood at 15%, double the national unemployment rate of 7%. Goa has the seventh-highest rate of unemployment among Indian states and the highest among the country's small states and Union territories.

It became apparent to the researcher that despite the state's renowned reputation as a sunny holiday destination, the issue of unemployment among locals has been steadily simmering for many years.






